This position is with the Administrative Office of the Courts, Judicial Branch Technology Project Support Section and will support the state-sponsored trial court integration efforts. Under general direction, the successful candidate analyzes, develops (designs, programs, and constructs), tests, implements, maintains, and modifies various platforms of information systems. Primary duties will include establishing a quality assurance program for a critical information exchange application and conducting application testing. Additional duties may include software development and application system administration tasks. Incumbents must have the ability to program in a general purpose programming language, develop written requirements for proposed applications, develop a quality assurance program, write and execute test scripts, and possess knowledge of the necessary interfaces to the computer operating system. This is a journey-level position and the incumbent is required to be fully competent to independently perform assigned duties. Incumbent will work on other major projects as part of a team and may be solely responsible for smaller projects. This position is located in Carson City, Nevada.

Education and Experience

Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with major course work in computer science, management information systems, or closely related field and two years of IT experience relevant to the duties of the position which may include computer operations, systems administration, network administration, database administration, and/or applications analysis and development; **OR** an equivalent combination of education and experience.
